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Phase I Implementation of SRSS Sanitation Project

Engineers Without Borders Nepal (EWBN) and Engineers Without Borders UC Berkeley collaboratively completed Phase I of the Shree Roshi Secondary School Sanitation Project over a three-week period (21 May 2026–11 June 2026). This implementation phase followed the assessment phase conducted in January 2026, during which multiple sanitation alternatives were evaluated using the Choosing by Advantages (CBA) methodology.
